CHAIRMAN'S NOTES

Welcome to our 2019 production and 98th - The Yeomen of the Guard.

First the sad news. In April Margaret Bannon, the Society's founder and latterly President, passed away. At 92, she had been involved with the Julian for over 70 years. She founded the Society in 1948 taking its name from Julian Avenue, Acton, where she lived at the time. Her aim

was for amateurs to put on the Gilbert and Sullivan operas in as professional a way as possible. Although the society has diversified its repertoire periodically with other light operas such as those by Strauss, Lehar and Offenbach, the Julian has over the years tried to keep alive an essential part of English musical heritage that encompasses the works of Gilbert and Sullivan.

Another loss during the year was John Ross, who died in January. A former local Councillor, he was a long standing patron of the Society and strong supporter of a wide range of cultural activities throughout the borough.

Putting on a show involves three key elements coming together – the singers, the orchestra and the set. Last year's production of *HMS Pinafore* got all these elements right. We were indebted to Martin Jarvis for the set design and to the whole company for erecting it with the theatre transformed into a late 19th century steamship. This resulted in a NODA District Award for the best G&S production and an award to Cora Hardy for best female singer in a G&S opera for her performance as Josephine.

This time the setting is the Tower of London which is not so easy to replicate on stage. But with Sullivan at his best, *The Yeomen of the Guard* will present a different challenge compared with *HMS Pinafore*, with the singers and music being paramount.

As always the production credits in the programme are extensive and we are extremely appreciative of the work undertaken by everyone supporting those on stage.

New members are always welcome – in all voice ranges. Previous experience is not required. We appreciate the support of our Patrons and of those who attend our shows regularly - if you are not on our mailing list, and wish to join this, or become a Patron, give your name with email address to a steward.

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Act One

Colonel Fairfax is awaiting execution at the Tower of London for sorcery. When his hopedfor reprieve fails to arrive, Sergeant Meryll and his daughter Phoebe, who is secretly fond of the Colonel, plot his escape. They plan to disguise him as Leonard Meryll who is shortly to join the Yeomen but whom no-one has yet seen. Unaware of their plan, Fairfax's last request is to die a married man, for, without a wife, his estate will fall into the hands of the kinsman who brought the charge of sorcery against him.

A willing candidate is found in Elsie Maynard. Although her companion, Jack Point, is initially worried at the proposal, his doubts are soon dispelled by the promise of a 100 crowns and the assurance that Elsie will be a widow within the hour. They are therefore horrified when they hear that Fairfax has escaped.

Act Two

Jack and Wilfred subsequently conspire to pretend that Wilfred has shot Fairfax and seen him drown, thereby releasing Elsie from the marriage contract. Fairfax, meanwhile, has discovered that Elsie is his wife (neither knew of the other's identity at the marriage ceremony), and is about to reveal this to her when the shot is heard and Jack and Wilfred spin their tale.

Elsie is distraught at the news of her husband's apparent death, but is comforted by "Leonard", alias Fairfax, who subsequently proposes to her. This enrages Phoebe who, in a jealous temper, confesses her feelings for "Leonard" to Wilfred realising, too late, that she is thereby claiming to be in love with her brother! Wilfred quickly deduces the true identity of "Leonard" and, in order to silence him, Phoebe consents to marriage. When her real brother brings news of Fairfax's reprieve, Elsie is initially distressed at the thought of leaving "Leonard" but overjoyed at the revelation that "Leonard" and Fairfax are one and the same.

Jack appeals to Elsie to reconsider his feelings for her, but in vain.

Peter Edwards - Sir Richard Cholmondelev

Peter is quite happy to be called Lieutenant of the Tower rather than his full title. Previous titles have included God (Jupiter in *Orpheus in the Underworld* 2005), Lord Tolloler (*Iolanthe* 2010), Emperor (*Mikado* 2014), Sergeant of Police (*Pirates* 2004 and thoroughly wound up 2015), King (*Princess Ida* 2016) and a Colonel (*Patience* 2017). He has come full circle and is happy to be having a second shot as Lieutenant. having played him in the 2009 production.

Tom Dalton - Colonel Fairfax

Tom has been a big fan of G&S since starting university; 9 years and 35 shows later, he is thrilled to be singing Fairfax for the third time, and re-using the halberds he made for UBG&SS' Yeomen in 2015. He has very much enjoyed his first show with JLOS, having joined the cast in October after the original Fairfax broke his ankle in an unfortunate accident*. In his spare time he is a doctor working in child and adolescent psychiatry.

Philip Lewis - Sergeant Meryll


Philip is very pleased to be playing Sergeant Meryll of the Yeomen of the Guard, who couldn't be more different to the politician Sir Joseph Porter whom he played in last year's production of *HMS Pinafore*. He has clearly seen a bit of life and has literally "been through the wars" and hoping to have a quiet retirement in the relative comfort of the grim old Tower. However, the red hot heat of battle stirs loyalties that last a lifetime and bind comrades in arms. For this reason, he

seems determined to risk himself and his family to repay a debt he owes to the prisoner.

Robert Brown - Leonard Meryll/First Yeoman

Robert is delighted to be returning to Julian Light (having previously played Ralph in last year's *HMS Pinafore*) to revisit a role that he first played way back in 2004 in his first G&S. He has since appeared in most of the G&S Operettas, some of them three or four times, and has played most of the tenor and some of the high baritone G&S roles. He has also appeared in many musicals most recently as Gerald in *Me and My Girl* and Nicely-Nicely in *Guys and Dolls* and will shortly be playing Mike in *High Society*.





Leon first performed Jack Point 30 years ago, as a Romantic Lead. Happy to play him now as a fading has-been 'turn' who has been treading the boards for too long! Otherwise, he apparently has sung a lot of opera, quite a bit of G&S (popping up as Bunthorne in *Patience* for JLOS a couple of years ago) and can't afford to retire from showbiz.



Geoff has trodden the boards for too many years to remember in West London amateur plays, musicals and operas. Geoff last performed with JLOS in their 2004 production of *The Pirates of Penzance*. He shared the part of Leporello in *Don Giovanni* with Harrow Opera way back in the day, and also remembers playing the Constable in Southall Operatic's production of *Fiddler on the Roof*.



James Navlor - Second Yeoman

James is a choral director and community practitioner working in the Greater London area. He is the MD of Waltham Forest Community Choir and touring chamber opera company the Willmore Singers. While reading music at the University of Birmingham, he was MD of the university's Gilbert and Sullivan Society and conducted an award winning performance of *Patience* at the Harrogate International Festival. Previous roles include Pooh-Bah (*The Mikado*), the Usher (*Trial by Jury*) and Dick Dead-Eve in JLOS's *HMS Pinafore*.



Having lived in Ealing for almost ten years, Stephanie is delighted to be appearing at Questors Theatre with the JLOS. She trained as an actor at the Hertfordshire Theatre School. Her credits include *The Witches* (Exeter Northcott), *The Daily Fail* (Arthur Cotterill Theatre, Kingston), *The Magic Flute* (The Bike Shed Theatre), *Strangers Welcome* (Tabard Theatre), *A Christmas Carol* (Petersham Playhouse) and UK tours of *Cinderella*, *Don Giovanni*, *Treasure Island*, and *Shakespeare Live!* A lifelong G&S fan, Stephanie played the plaintiff



in *Trial By Jury,* as well as performing in two works by G&S contemporary Edward German:

Tom Jones and Merrie England.

Sunita Dugal - Phoebe MervII

Sunita thinks this is her 16th show with the Julian, but has stopped counting really! Last year she had great fun playing lowly bumboat woman Buttercup. Recent roles include Lady Angela in *Patience*, Melissa in *Princess Ida* and Ruth in *The Pirates of Penzance*. This year she reprises the role of Phoebe, her favourite of all the G&S character roles.





Debbie Edwards - Dame Carruthers



Catherine Bench - Kate

Catherine graduated from Durham University in June 2018 with a Music degree where she received a first for her vocal studies. Throughout university she was heavily involved with productions, especially with the Durham Opera Ensemble (DOE) where she played principle roles, including Buttercup, HMS Pinafore and The Mad Hatter, Alice's Adventure's in Wonderland (Todd). Since graduating, Catherine has received the position of Soprano Lay Clerk at



St. Barnabas Church, Ealing and also took to the Questors stage last Christmas playing the title role in *Sleeping Beauty* the annual pantomime. She is delighted to be returning to Questors for the second time this year and hopes that you thoroughly enjoy the "Strange Adventure" which will be told tonight!





Fraser Grant - Director

Fraser Grant studied French at Edinburgh University, and then went on to train as a director at Drama Studio, London. He has a very busy freelance directing career, working mainly in Opera. He is also Head of Drama at Harvington Prep. School in Ealing, and was Head of Drama at the LCM Junior College from 1998-2012. As a Theatre Director he has directed many productions including A Midsummer Night's Dream, The Tempest, Abigail's Party, The Wanderer, Broken Glass, The Importance of Being Earnest and The Threepenny Opera. He directed the Scottish

premiere of Sondheim's Into the Woods and has won several awards for Best Production on the Edinburgh Fringe. He has also worked extensively in Italy where he has directed touring productions of A Midsummer Night's Dream, The Tempest, Twist and Shout, The Beatles' Story, Jekyll and Hyde, Romeo and Juliet, A Christmas Carol, The Blues Brothers, Comedy of Errors and Hamlet. As a lyricist, he has written many songs for the cabaret duo OperaTottie, and has translated The Magic Flute, Cosi Fan Tutte, La Cenerentola, Fidelio, La Boheme, Die Fledermaus, Orpheus in the Underworld and La Belle Hélène. He is now almost exclusively a director of Opera and has directed most of the operas in the popular canon. This is his 22nd production for JLOS.



Jack Wong - Musical Director

Jack Wong began his piano studies at the age of five and violin studies at the age of eight. Jack graduated from the Royal Academy of Music with a first class honours bachelor degree in Violin Performance and obtained a Master's Degree at the Guildhall School of Music & Drama in Opera studies with a full scholarship. Jack was the resident music scholar of Robert Anderson Research Charitable Trust London which supported his studies in London. He is the artistic director and conductor of Hornton Chamber Orchestra, an ensemble he founded in

2015 with students from London conservatoires.

Most notable achievements include third prize winner in the International Concerto Competition – debut at the Berlin Philharmonic Hall conducting category and gave his Berlin debut with Eurasia Chamber Orchestra at the French Cathedral. He is also the third prize winner of the Pancho Vladigerov International Violin Competition. Jack has also taken part in the Chipping Campden International Music Festival for two consecutive years, and performed with London Symphony Orchestra String Academy, as well as the International Schleswig-Holstein Music Festival Orchestra Academy in Germany. He also took part in the Verbier Festival Conductor Mentorship Programme where he assisted conductors such as Valery Gergiev.


